## Building Homes That Change Lives Since 1985



For 30 years, Habitat Pinellas has worked with hundreds of local businesses and government officials, and astonishingly, hundreds of thousands of community volunteers who believe in the mission of Habitat for Humanity. With each swing of a hammer and every nail pounded, the work has been a labor of love that has united all those who have invested their time, expertise and monetary gifts. And for each of the 343 homes we've built to date, the impact of our work extends far beyond completing construction.

For 30 years, community support has helped break the cycle of poverty for these families. The financial burden of living paycheck to paycheck has been eased by an affordable monthly mortgage. They no longer have to decide between paying rent or putting food on the table or gas in the car.

And with their "forever" homes, Habitat families no longer are forced to chronically move to escape increasing rent and bad landlords. Their children no longer have to adapt to new schools and making new friends with every relocation. Many Habitat families describe the "peace of mind" that their homes have brought them. It's a lasting impact that not only provides a secure family home, but has also been found to spur better performance of children in school, improve health and inspire a more positive outlook for the future.

We extend a sincere thank you to our local community who has supported Habitat Pinellas for the past 30 years. Together, we have built homes, not houses. Homes that change lives.

## 1985 BACK IN THE DAY

- In 1985, there were only 89 U.S. Habitat affiliates. Today, there are over 1,400.
- Established on January 14, 1985, Habitat Pinellas received its official affiliation status on April 20, 1985. Organizing efforts began in 1984 under

- the leadership of volunteer executive director **James Schwarzlose**.
- The first executive director for the newly established affiliate was **Tom Webster**.
- The first Board chair was Bill Daniel.
- The first groundbreaking took place on March 29, 1985.
- The first volunteer day took place on March 30, 1985 with volunteer **Ron Rocks** felling a tall dead pine tree.
- The first volunteer group was from Oakhurst United Methodist Church in Seminole led by **John and Vonnie Stemen** clearing land on April 3, 1985.
- The first land acquisition was a sweet heart deal that occurred on February 14, 1985, when Habitat Pinellas purchased

six lots at the corner of 13th Street N. and 4th Avenue N. from the City of St. Pete for \$50 per lot. You read the right!

- The first Habitat Pinellas homeowner was **Jane Dunaway**, who also was the first to pay off her mortgage in 2004.
- Habitat Pinellas has been tithing to Habitat Guatemala since 1985 to build simple, earthquake-resistant homes – a tradition we've maintained for 30 years.

"My daughter benefitted quite well from being in our home. It allowed us to function the way we needed to. She's currently in the military and in college. I'll never leave this house. It's ours forever."

**CYNTHIA IVY, Homeowner.** Since completing her sweat equity hours and moving into her own home in 2008, homeowner Cynthia Ivy has continued to volunteer over the past seven years to help other families and build 10 more homes. As the housing program coordinator for CASA, Cynthia has encouraged CASA residents to apply for the Habitat program. Three of the women she's encouraged have gone on to become Habitat homeowners. "I was a homeless person and a domestic violence survivor," said Cynthia. "I know what it's like to have sleepless nights and not have stability. When I was working my sweat equity, my daughter wasn't old enough to help me, so all the hours were on me alone. That is why I help out other Habitat homeowner candidates who don't have anyone to help them."

**TOM OBERHOFER, Volunteer.** Retired Eckerd College economics professor Tom Oberhofer has been volunteering on Habitat Pinellas construction sites since 1993. For many of his 22 years of volunteering, he has been working a couple days a week assisting as a site supervisor. He chose building for Habitat over other volunteer opportunities because he likes the physical nature of the work, the interaction and feedback he hears from homeowners and volunteers, and "sharing the joy of the build."



"We used to be cramped, all living in one bedroom. Now we live in a three bedroom house – a real luxury!"

**JANE DUNAWAY, First Homeowner.** Our first executive director, Tom Webster, recounted a conversation with the first Habitat Pinellas family – Jane Dunaway and her sons, Robert and Tim. Jane worked for minimum wage at a local nursing home. "Shortly after moving into her house, Jane called me over one day. She had her bills laying on the table. Her electric bill was substantially less for a brand new three-bedroom home than for her dilapidated apartment. She picked up her property tax bill, waving it like a flag, exclaiming, 'It's official! I'm a real homeowner now!' I do believe she is the only person I have ever encountered who couldn't wait to pay her property taxes!"

2015 has served as the 30th anniversary of Habitat for Humanity of Pinellas County. Thanks to your support, hundreds of families have enjoyed the opportunity to improve their housing situation through a zero-percent interest mortgage, providing a safe and affordable place to live for their family for years to come.

Through the commitment of our Habitat partner families, board of directors, volunteers, donors and staff, our affiliate was able to make a deep impact in Pinellas County this year:

- 32 Families served in fiscal year 2014-2015.
- More than 30,000 volunteer hours helped construct these homes.
- For the 9th consecutive year, Habitat Pinellas was recognized by Charity Navigator as a four-star charity, an accomplishment that less than 1% of charities evaluated nationwide have achieved.
- Habitat Pinellas opened a second ReStore location which is located in Palm Harbor.
- Our 340+ homeowners provided more than \$330,000 to Pinellas County through homeowner taxes.
- 94 cents of every dollar donated to Habitat Pinellas goes directly to building affordable homes for low-income families in our community!
- Throughout this ongoing growth, Habitat Pinellas was able to increase its long-term sustainability by increasing cash reserves by 35%.

We are proud of our families for their dedication to improve not only their lives, but also the lives of their children. Now in our second year of a four-year strategic plan, Habitat Pinellas will continue focusing on growth, quality and sustainability.
