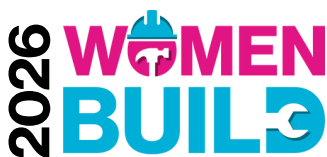

Celina is a single mom of five who has worked as a Corrections Officer at Sumter Correctional Institution for the past three years. She shares that her family is active, close-knit, and faith-driven. Together, they enjoy sports, traveling, trying new foods, and spending quality time with friends and loved ones. Her oldest daughter, Alyssa, is preparing for her senior year and is already earning college credits. Xzavier enjoys playing flag football and video games. Aaliyah participates in multiple sports, including volleyball and track, and likes to relax with a movie. Clement is an honor-roll student who plays several sports and loves being active with friends. Aryana, the youngest, is creative and loves arts and crafts.

Since becoming a single mother in 2020, Celina has struggled to find affordable housing large enough for her family. Currently, they live in a two-bedroom townhouse just under 1,000 square feet. To make it work, she built a temporary wall to create a third "bedroom," which her sons share without a door. She and her youngest daughter share a room, while her two oldest daughters share another. Despite these challenges, Celina has remained determined to create stability and a true home for her children.

When she learned she was accepted into the Habitat program, Celina felt beyond excited, grateful, and relieved that homeownership was finally within reach. She looks forward to celebrating holidays and family gatherings in her new home. After years of long nights at work, saving, and planning, she says, "It will be the start of something new for my family." To her, "this home will be filled with laughter and love" and "the place I look forward to resting my head after a long day." Most of all, Celina shares, "It's never too late – I want my kids to have the home we've all dreamed of."
